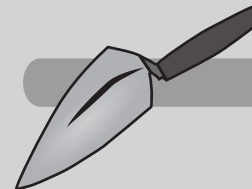


Charles Kauffman,

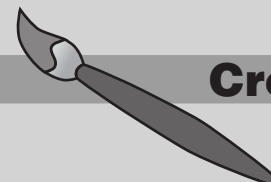

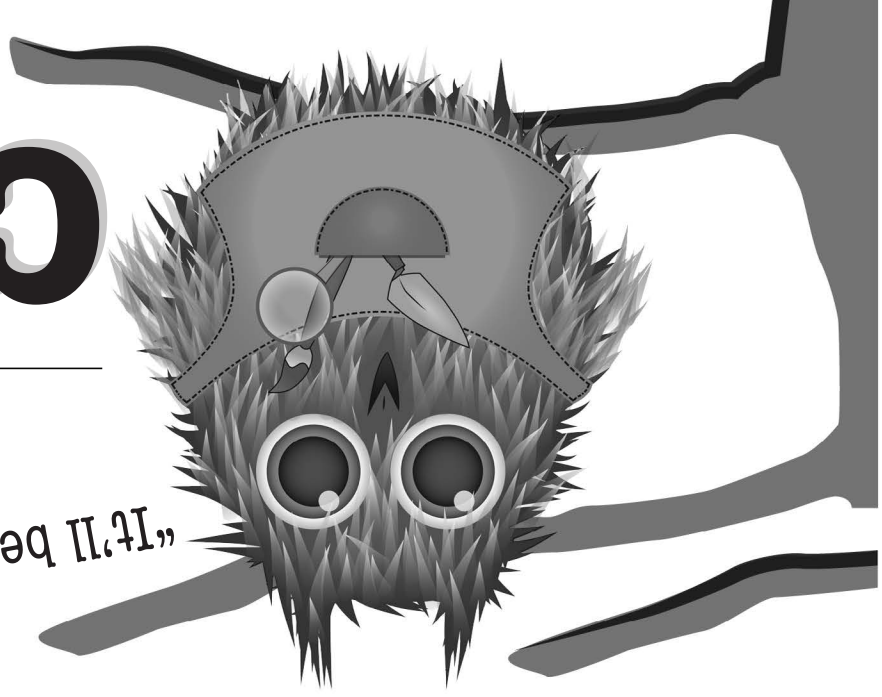
