Tour overview: As the world commemorates the centennial of the First World War, Kauffman Museum will host a new exhibition, *Voices of Conscience: Peace Witness in The Great War.* In conjunction with the exhibit, we are offering a one-day visit to the National World War I Museum. The museum will be interesting for everyone, not just military history buffs. Afternoon options vary.

Pre and post-tour programs: Kauffman Museum has lectures scheduled to coincide with the *Voices of Conscience* exhibit. Tour participants are encouraged to attend these free events at the museum: Sept. 10, 3:00, Sunday-Afternoon-at-the-Museum, Rachel Waltner Goossen. Dr. Goossen will speak on the history of conscientious objection. Kansas Humanities Council program.

Sept. 10, 4:00, Opening reception for the *Voices of Conscience* special exhibition.

Oct. 14, 2:00, Fall Fest, Remembering the Schowalter Oral History Project panel discussion.

Oct. 18, 6:00, *The Story of Hutterite Martyrs*, Dwayne Stoltzfus. Dr. Stoltzfus will reflect on the WWI centennial and his research on Hutterites during the war. Kansas Humanities Council program.

Oct. 29, 3:00, Sunday-Afternoon-at-the-Museum, Brad Born. Dr. Born will explore Pat Barker's novel *Regeneration*, a fictionalized account of a soldier's WWI experiences recounted from his hospital bed.

Nov. 16, 5:30, Film: *Behind the Lens*. After viewing the screen adaptation of Barker's novel *Regeneration*, Brad Born will lead a panel discussion on the film.

Breakfast. We'll serve breakfast muffins and juice on the bus and make a stop for coffee on the way.

National World War I Museum & Memorial, KC, MO. After opening, staff at the WWI Museum realized visitors needed 1-2 days to thoroughly visit the museum. You will be able to choose whether to spend your entire day there or go to nearby sites. We'll start with a short introductory audio-visual program. Afterward you may use an audio-guide, go on a guided tour or look on your own. After lunch you may continue to view the museum or visit one or both of the adjacent sites listed below.

Lunch, Over There Café, at the WWI Museum. We'll break for lunch at the museum.

Crown Center, KC, MO (optional). Kansas City's upscale shopping mall, Crown Center, offers independent and chain retailers. Our bus will take you to the entrance or you may walk.

The Money Museum at the Federal Reserve Bank, KC, MO (optional). Have you ever seen a fork lift carrying a palette of bills? Here's your chance. Exhibits describe the American economic system. You may take home a free, small bag of shredded money. Keep it or give it to a friend!

Supper, Trail Days Café & Museum at the historic Rawlinson-Terwilliger Home, Council Grove, KS. This museum complex with a restaurant celebrates the many cultures and eras of Kansas history. Before or after supper, you may view the seven historic buildings on site.

Cost includes all meals, all admissions, travel by modern motor coach with a restroom, and gratuities. Fee is refundable (minus \$25 processing fee per person) prior to September 13.
